<ul> <li>What will I be studying?</li> <li>Performing Music <ul> <li>Solo and ensemble performances on an instrument of your choice, or voice</li> <li>Choice of repertoire and style to suit your abilities.</li> <li>Should be able to perform at a Grade 4 standard (minimum) by Spring of Year 11</li> </ul> </li> <li>Composing Music <ul> <li>Composing in a range of styles both historical and contemporary, using instruments, voices and Music Technology</li> </ul> </li> <li>Listening and Appraising <ul> <li>Analysing and understanding eight set pieces from areas of study ranging from Bach to Queen</li> <li>Recognising and techniques</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>What skills will I develop?</li> <li>Confidence in playing an instrument or singing both solo and in a group. The Music Department will offer you appropriate instrumental lessons</li> <li>Improvising musical ideas and composing complete pieces using notation and/or Music technology</li> <li>Analysing and understanding different styles of Music, and using the concepts learned to compose, perform and record your own music</li> <li>Reading and writing music and keyboard harmony skills</li> <li>Using technical language to describe, compare and evaluate music</li> <li>Analysing music from a range of backgrounds</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>How will the course be structured?</li> <li>60% Practical coursework and 40% Written Examination (Theory)</li> <li>Year 10</li> <li>Topics from all Areas of Study: Instrumental Music 1700-1820, Vocal Music, Music for Stage and Screen, Fusions</li> <li>Short composition assignments leading to development of your free composition</li> <li>Performing as a soloist and in an ensemble</li> <li>Year 11</li> <li>Looking in more detail at set works and developing listening skills</li> <li>Recording your final solo and ensemble performances</li> <li>Completing two final compositions. The first to a brief set by Edexcel, the second from your year 10 free compositions</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>How will I be assessed?</li> <li>Internal Assessment</li> <li>Performing – 30%</li> <li>One solo performance – 15%</li> <li>One ensemble performance – 15%</li> <li>Composing – 30%</li> <li>One composition to a choice of four briefs – 15%</li> <li>One free composition – 15%</li> <li>External Assessment</li> <li>Listening and Appraising – 40%</li> <li>105-minute examination in two parts</li> <li>Listening test with eight short questions. Seven, including a dictation exercise, relate to set works, one is unseen.</li> <li>Longer essay question comparing a set work with an unseen piece of music</li> </ul>
